

## REFERENCE: PEACE STUDIES AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

A comprehensive, annotated guide to peace studies and conflict resolution programs at colleges and universities worldwide. This edition profiles over 450 undergraduate, master's and doctoral programs, and research centers in 40 countries and 38 U.S. states. Entries describe the program's philosophy and goals, examples of course offerings and requirements, degrees and certificates offered, and complete contact information, including e-mail and website addresses. Indices by state, country, religious affiliation and type of degree, and an appendix with a list of journals that publish in the field internationally are also included.
